**ADDENDUM**

**NEVADA SERVICE STANDARD 15-11(V)(b)**

**As Stated:** “The subrecipient must ensure that medical transportation services are provided in the most cost-effective manner possible to meet the needs of multiple clients. Therefore, in areas where public transportation is available, a bus pass (one-way or two-way) is the first choice for clients accessing Ryan White Transportation.”

**Additional:** In order to protect client’s health and adhere to the Governor’s mandate of social distancing the program will allow for subrecipients to use greater flexibility in determining what services are best to meet the transportation needs of clients. Greater use of rideshare and gas vouchers will be allowed in lieu of the use of Bus Passes when subrecipients deem it appropriate. This change will last as long as necessary to adhere to the Governor’s mandates.

**NEVADA SERVICE STANDARD 15-11(IV) (TRANSPORTATION SERVICES)**

**As Stated:** Transportation scheduling may be utilized by the subrecipient to document staff effort to schedule clients’ transportation needs, such as van ride and ridesharing scheduling. There must be direct contract with clients to be considered transportation scheduling and not an administrative expense.

**Additional:** In order to protect client’s health and adhere to the Governor’s mandate of social distancing the program will expand **Transportation Scheduling (Service F)** to include the scheduling and dropping off of medication(s) to clients by subrecipients to a scheduled off site location. This change will last as long as necessary to adhere to the Governor’s mandates.
