

## **NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE STATE OF NEVADA'S ANALYSIS OF IMPEDIMENTS TO FAIR HOUSING AND 2025-2029 CONSOLIDATED PLAN**

The State of Nevada will hold a public hearing to obtain input on housing and community development needs for the development of the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing (AI), 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan (Con Plan), and 2025 Action Plan. The AI identifies impediments to fair housing choice within the State and outlines the actions to be taken to overcome the effects of any impediments identified. The Con Plan describes how the State will use funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in the 2025-2029 program years. For the 2025 program year, the State estimates it will receive \$9,927,131 in funding from HUD for the Community Development Block Grant (\$2,898,567), HOME (\$2,856,000), Housing Trust Fund (\$3,144,833), Emergency Solutions Grant (\$487,812) and HOPWA (\$539,919) programs. The overall goal of these programs is to develop viable urban communities by providing decent housing, suitable living environments, and expanding economic opportunities principally for low – and moderate-income persons.
